

Timothy A. Mayo A Life History

Timothy A. Mayo was born June 30, 1922, in Guilford, Maine. He was the son of Timothy A. and Daisy E. (Kimball) Mayo. He grew up with two sisters Alice and Florence. He graduated from Guilford High School in 1940. Tim was employed at Hardwood Products Company in Guilford until he was drafted into the US Army in 1943 and served as a MP in Europe until discharged in 1945. Upon his return home, Tim attended Husson College in Bangor, Maine, graduating in 1949 and later obtained his Masters Degree at Boston University. Before leaving for the service in World War II, Tim was the Coach of the Guilford Grammar School Boys Basketball Team. In the year of 1948 (60 years ago) on April 3rd, he led his team to the State Championship (pictured on page 3). In 1949, he again took his team to the State Championship losing to Bath by only 2 points.

Tim taught for 16 years as well as doing some coaching at Farmington High School, and was employed in real estate by Clyde Barrows and Palmer Realty in Farmington. Uncle Tim was a great sports fan, following the Red Sox faithfully. Tim married Isabelle C. Zimba on September 25, 1964. He spent 18 winters in the Green Valley area of Arizona, and living on South Strong Road, Farmington in the summers. They moved to the Residential Living section of Edgewood Rehabilitation and Residential Living Center on Fairbanks Road in Farmington October 2004. He died on December 10, 2007 at the age of 85. He was survived by his stepdaughter, Lorraine I. Zimmerman of Green Valley, AZ, a grandson, Richard James Zimmerman of Tucson, AZ, as well as many nieces and nephews including: Dora Pinkham of Belmont, Merrill Bridges of Parkman, Janice Tobias of Hampden, Ruth Grindell of Anaheim, CA., Carolyn Dickison of York, PA. He was predeceased by his sisters Alice and Florence, niece Joyce Simpson-Cyr of Bucksport and FL, and nephew Lawrence Bridges in IL.
